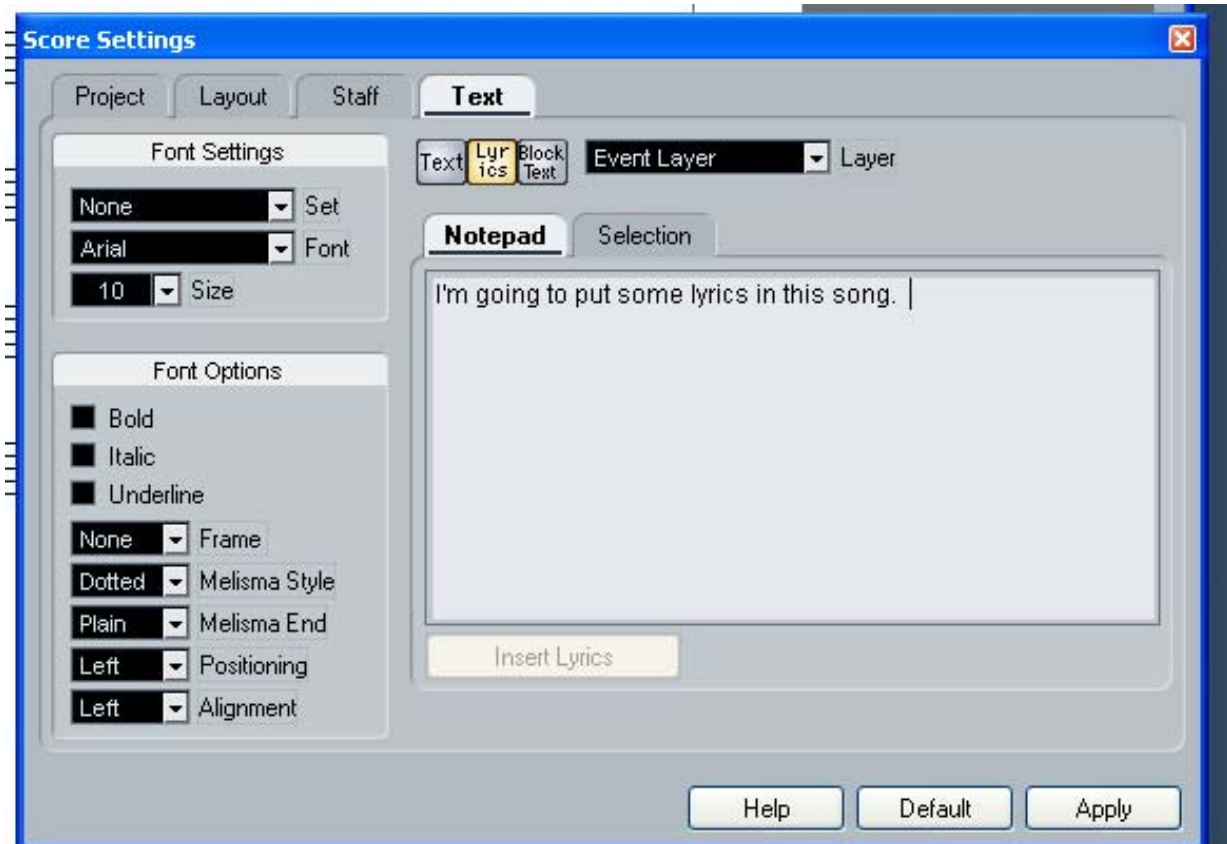


Cubase 4 Score - Lyrics Insert

1. Open Score Settings, and go to Text, Notepad.
2. Enter the text.



3. Select the first note to which the lyrics should be added.
