

Key Commands in Wavelab 6

Inside Wavelab there are quiet a few default key commands that allow functions and commands to be executed with a few simple key strokes. A key command can be one or several key strokes assigned to a specific function within Wavelab to make for a quicker, more productive workflow.

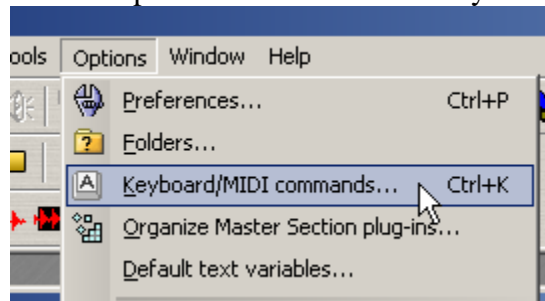
Transport: these key commands are all assigned to the number pad keys

Play : Num Enter
Record : Num *
Stop : 0 (num pad)

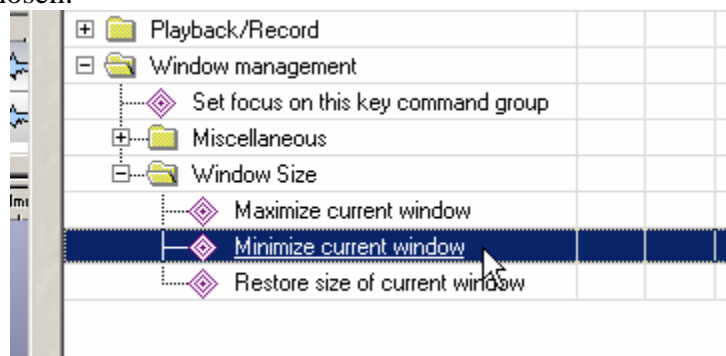
The three key commands for basic Transport functions listed below are just a few examples of key commands that are used in Wavelab 6. You may also define your own key commands for a number of functions in the program. A full list of all the default key commands in the software can be found in the Key Commands section of the Operation Manual located under the Help menu.

To define your own custom key commands follow these steps:

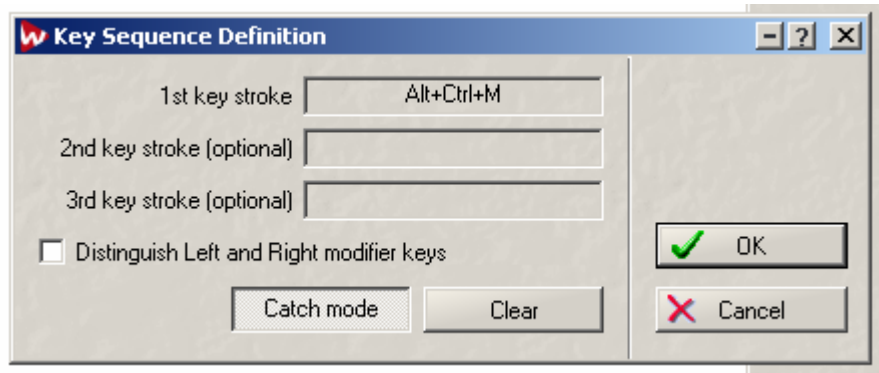
1. Click on the Options menu and select Keyboard/MIDI Commands



2. Once in the Key Commands window you will see folders under the Descriptions column. In each one of the folders are descriptions of functions within the software. These functions may or may not have key commands already assigned to them. Locate the function that you would like to assign a key command to and double click on it. For this example, 'Minimize Current Window' is chosen.



3. After double clicking on the function, a dialog box will come up that allows a key command sequence to be assigned. With the catch mode assigned, any key sequence performed on the keyboard will be assigned. For example, pressing Ctrl+Alt+M will assign it to the function.



4. Now that the key command has been assigned, press the OK button. Now whenever the key command sequence is performed the specific function that the command is assigned to will be performed.
