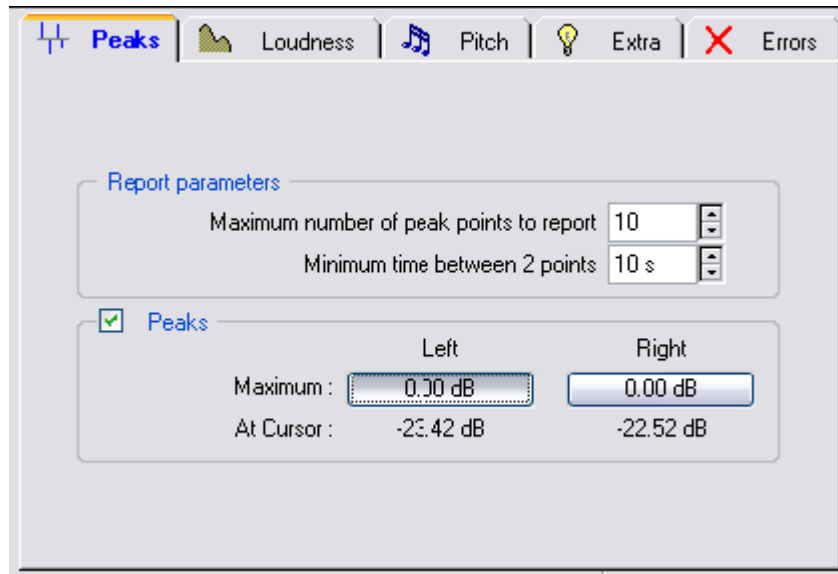


Wavelab 6: The Peaks tab

The Peaks tab can be found in the Global Analysis window. A quick way to access the Global Analysis window is to select the “Y” key on your computer keyboard.



The options in the Peaks tab are used to find peak values in the audio, that is, single samples with very high values.

Parameters

There are two report parameters:

- “Maximum number...” allows you to put restrictions on how many points will be reported. For example, setting this to “1” will make the program report only the highest peak (or one of the peaks with the highest value – if there are several with the same value).
- “Minimum time...” lets you set things up so that the points don’t occur too close. Settings this to “1 s” will ensure there is always at least a second between reported points.

Result

The Result fields show you the following values:

<u>Option</u>	<u>Description</u>
Maximum	The highest peak in the analyzed section.
At Cursor	The level of the sample at the wave cursor position, at the time of the analysis.
